

- Music Express used throughout the school in all classes. Lessons are taught weekly and are adapted for pupils with additional needs.
- Curriculum builds upon skills from previous years and is in line with the Model Music Curriculum.
- Instruments are of a large variety and of a great quality and quantity.
- Pupils engage in whole-class percussive instrument sessions, using Music Express curriculum.
- iPads in school have Garage band and Launchpad.
- All pupils engage in performance opportunities at least once a term: Christmas shows / Spring Showcase / Class assemblies.
- KS2 Choir ran weekly for the whole school year. Pupils develop an awareness of their voice, how to properly warm up and sing with correct technique.
- Choir pupils regularly take part in performance opportunities outside of school Young Voices every two years, G4 Christmas Concert at Hereford Cathedral, School performances at Hereford Cathedral, fundraising at local supermarkets and Voces8.
- Teachers use adaptive teaching to ensure all pupils access music lessons.

All music lessons follow the Music Express Primary Music Curriculum which is in line with the Model Music Curriculum 2021.

- Support for extra-curricular music opportunities
