English

For the first half of this term, we'll focus on SATs revision, covering key reading comprehension skills and revisiting spelling, punctuation, and grammar. After SATs, we'll use Kensuke's Kingdom to inspire writing tasks, including diary entries, persuasive letters, and descriptive narratives. Pupils will also explore the novel's themes and characters through discussions and creative activities. We will also begin to look at formal and informal writing in more depth.

Mathematics

In maths, we will begin the term by revising key maths concepts in preparation for the SATs, focusing on arithmetic, reasoning, and problemsolving. After the tests, we'll apply these skills through real-life contexts linked to Kensuke's Kingdom, such as calculating distances, interpreting data, and using coordinates.

Science

In science, we'll explore two key areas: light and the human body. Children will investigate how light travels, shadows form, and how we see. Later in the term, we'll look at the human circulatory system and how to keep our bodies healthy

Geography & History

In geography, we'll study Japan's location, climate, and physical features, and compare it to the UK. Children will also track Michael's journey from the story using maps and atlases. In history, explore Japan's role in World War II to better understand Kensuke's background. They'll create timelines and reflect on how history shapes personal stories.

Class 6 Summer 2025

We will start with SATs preparation, revising key skills in maths, reading, grammar, punctuation, and spelling to ensure every child feels confident and ready. After SATs, we'll dive into an exciting, cross-curricular topic inspired by Kensuke's Kingdom, exploring Japan, adventure, resilience, and survival across various subjects. We'll also be preparing for our residential trip to Oaker Wood, which promises to be a fantastic opportunity for children to develop teamwork, independence, and outdoor skills—reflecting themes from our class novel.

This term, music will centre around our end-of-year performance of Madagascar. Children will learn songs, practise vocal techniques, and develop their performance skills in preparation for the
